**David Dyjack, PhD**

David Dyjack is a Professor of Environmental and Occupational Health, and Associate Dean for Public Health Practice at Loma Linda University School of Public Health. He received a doctorate in public health from the University of Michigan, an MSPH in industrial hygiene from the University of Utah, and is a board certified industrial hygienist. He has provided leadership in varied public health activities since the mid-1980s. These efforts include oversight of grants and contracts for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), Department of Labor, and the Department of Defense. Additionally, he has provided consultations to the International Labour Organization (ILO), Saudi Aramco, Exxon, and Texaco, among others. Dr. Dyjack is principal investigator for the Loma Linda University Center for Public Health Preparedness and the Regional Academic Center of Excellence in Environmental Health.
